

WHAT A CHARACTER® PUSH MOLDS

Artist Maureen Carlson has been creating whimsical people and other characters with polymer clays for many years. While a shopkeeper at the Minnesota Renaissance Festival, demand for her figures was staggering. She and her husband, Dan, discussed face molds that could help speed up production but would they be detailed enough? The first molds made by Dan worked great and were an instant hit with her students.

There are 7 face, hand, and feet molds in the What a Character® series. Suggestions for which molds should be used together to create dolls and other fun figures with correct proportions are listed with each mold. Because the modeling material is soft when you remove it from the mold, you can vary the size of each piece by either stretching or compressing it. As a result, you may prefer to pair one face mold with more than one size of hands or feet.
